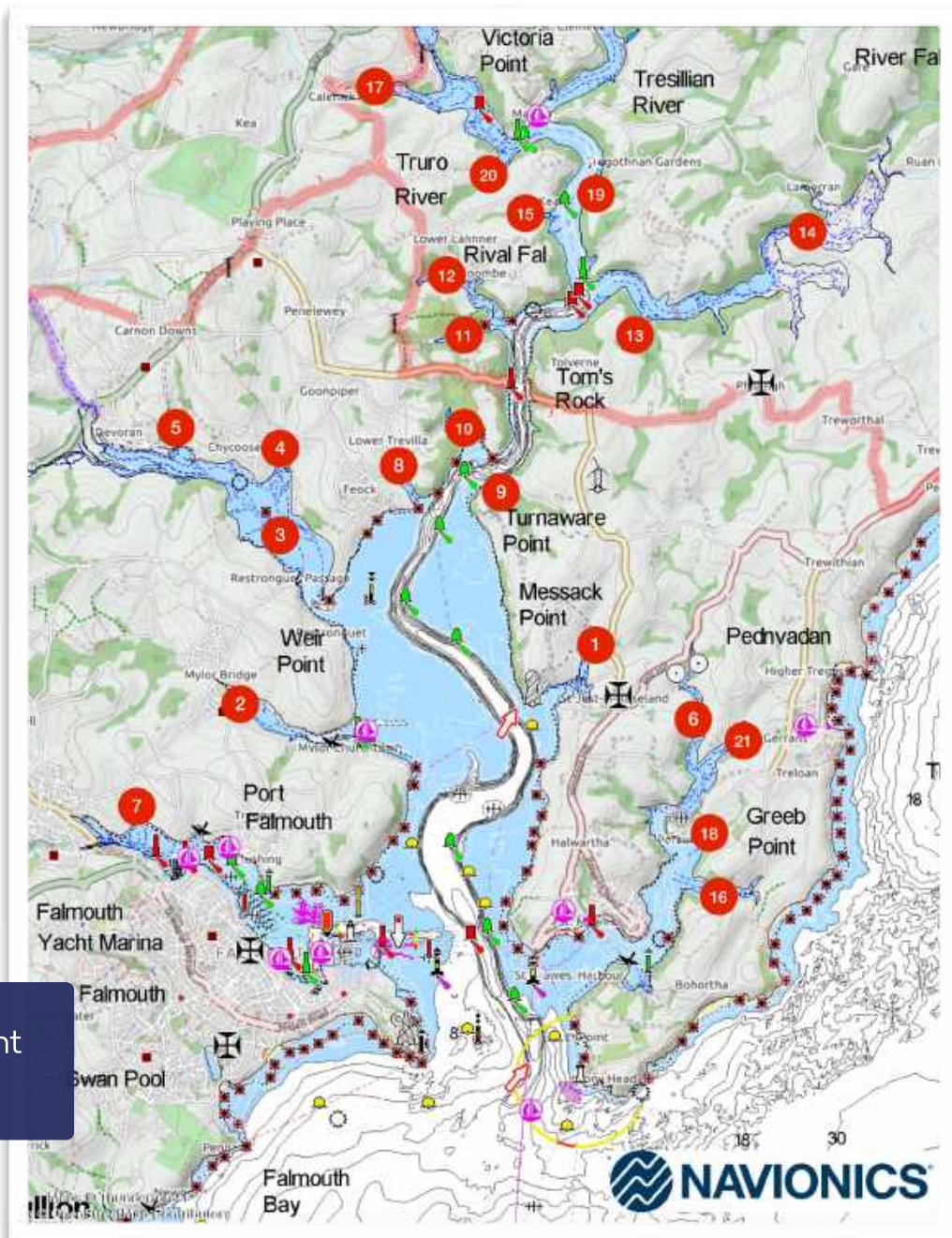




1) St Just Creek.










